## SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The papers of Emanuel Metzger cover the period from 1917 to 1980. Metzger served under Dwight D. Eisenhower at Camp Colt, Pennsylvania during World War I. Since that time he has been active in Veterans organizations and Tank Corps Association reunions. His papers include promotion warrants signed by Eisenhower and correspondence with both the President and Mrs. Eisenhower. The bulk of the collection deals with Metzger's military service and his veterans groups affiliations. The collection is arranged chronologically; the general arrangement was assigned by the processing archivist. Folder titles assigned by the archivist have been placed in brackets.
