Russian troops were advancing westward on the eastern side of the Elbe, and due to lack of coordination between the commands, no one knew exactly where the first meeting would take place. Finally, one of the patrols of the [blank] Division contacted the Russians just east of the Elbe. The following day a huge party of dignitaries and press rushed to Torgau for the ‘official’ celebration. These pictures were taken that day during the festivities. Lt. COLONEL THOR M. SMITH had flown from Paris to the First Army press camp at
